Our Mission is to Evangelise, our Vision is to see Christ in all we do and our Purpose is to serve.

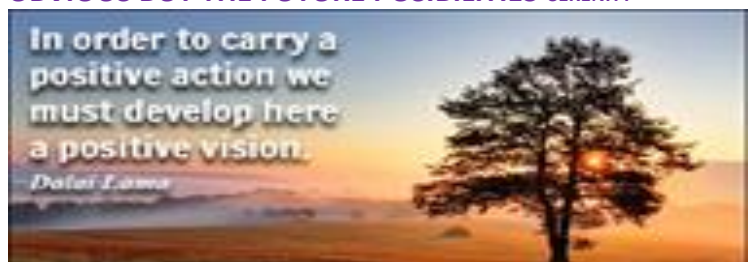

We warmly welcome our new Reception and Nursery classes to school this week on the 7th and 8th of September when their home visits are completed (for our new pupils only). As these little ones begin to find their way around their new classrooms and the school, they will be kindly assisted by our hardworking and experienced EYFS staff-so we ask all our understanding parents in this phase of the school, to assist the staff with getting the children settled as quickly as is possible each morning by leaving the teachers to take charge of our precious little angels -and taking their leave as quickly as is possible. Our OOHL/PE team have tried to ensure places have been allocated fairly to all new pupils but please **note** that not every child will get their choice of clubs as most clubs have a quota for health and safety and management reasons. All children, including year six pupils are asked to join at least two clubs as our aim is to make our pupils optimally rounded, balancing academic prowess while fully developing all their latent talents and skills in a range of areas as "To be truly educated is to be multi-faceted!". Our staff generously give their time to run clubs so we require all our children in clubs to behave appropriately or this privilege could be lost.

Attendance and Punctuality
