CATHOLIC PILGRIMS VISIT ROME'S HOLY DOOR

A pilgrim is a person who goes on a Sacred Journey often with a religious or moral purpose, usually to a foreign land or Holy Shrine.

Examples:

Muslims go to Mecca Hindus go to the Ganges

Sikhs Go to Amritsar

Catholics go to Lourdes

When you make a special journey to a place you consider sacred, you are a pilgrim.

Symbolism in the Jubilee Banner What might the anchor represent? What does the cross mean? Why do they hold it high and so tightly? Why are they above the sea? Who are these 4 people? What do the colours represent?

Official Jubilee Logo Meaning:

The logo chosen for the Holy Jubilee Year of Hope depicts four stylised and graceful figures, in four colours that recall the shades of the rainbow: red, orange, green, and blue-God's Sign of Covenant with all humanity


The choice of colours are the <u>colours of sacred</u> <u>vestments</u> worn by priests throughout the liturgical year.

Red: symbolizes love, passion, and self-sacrifice: Saints who died for their faith, Christ's sacrifice and His boundless love for all humanity, but also the fire of the Holy Spirit and His strength that animates Christians.


Orange: expresses joy, vitality, and enthusiasm, the light that illuminates the path of faith.

Green: is universally recognised as the colour of **hope**, **growth**, and **rebirth**.


Blue: symbolises faith, peace, and tranquillity, evoking the endless expanse of the sky and our capacity for spirituality- inviting contemplation and prayer



When you go on a pilgrimage, you do not travel alone. You are with people of the same mind, with the intent to deepen your faith and stay grounded.



The anchor is a Christian symbol for hope and steadfastness. The source for this symbol is in Hebrews 6:19 "Hope we have as an anchor of the soul, both sure and steadfast." Anchors are a strong ancient Christian symbol and are found in many inscriptions in the catacombs/tombs of Rome.



We can all be Pilgrims of Hope (in 2025), so let's start our journey right now! Pope Francis says: "By our actions, our words, the decisions we make each day, our patient efforts to sow seeds of beauty and kindness wherever we find ourselves, we want to sing of hope...and reawaken in every heart the joy and the courage to embrace life to the full." The knock on the Holy Door symbolizes the release of graces and removal of obstacles in union with God. Jesus opens the door to salvation setting into action Remission of temporal punishment for all pilgrims' sins = An indulgence or Special Gift of forgiveness from GOD
