Good Friday

Jesus rises from the dead, appearing to His followers. (Matthew 28:1-13, Mark 16:1-14, Luke 24:1-49, John 20:1-23)

Theme: St Paul's Message -Knowing Christ is more valuable than any worldly possession Reading: Philippians 3: 8-14

8 Indeed, I count everything as loss because of the superior worth of knowing Christ Jesus my Lord. For his sake, I have suffered the loss of all things and count them as nothing, in order that I may gain Christ 9 and be found in Him, not having a righteousness of my own that comes from the law, but that which comes through faith in Christ, the righteousness from God that depends on faith. ¹⁰ I pray that I may know Him and the power of His resurrection, and may share His sufferings, becoming like Him in His death; ¹¹ and by his act of mercy and salvation, may I attain the resurrection from the dead which he secured for me.

Straining Toward the Goal

¹² It is not that I have already obtained this or am already perfect, but that I press on, determined to make it my own, because Christ Jesus has made me his own. ¹³ Brothers and sisters, I do not consider that I have gained salvation on my own, but only through the sacrifice of Christ. One thing I will continue to do: forgetting what lies behind, I will keep straining forward to what lies ahead. ¹⁴ I press on toward the goal for the prize of the upward call of God in Christ Jesus.

How Will You Celebrate Palm Sunday 2025?





The First Palm Sunday:

Jesus rides Into Jerusalem on a donkey to the waving of palm branches and shouts of 'Hosanna'!

The religious symbolism is rich.

Palm Sunday Celebration in India with children lining the streets with their parents and families singing:"होसंत्रा" (Hōsanna).

Palm Sunday Procession in Ireland with believers proclaiming:
"Hosanna to the Son of David,
Blessed is He who comes in the name of the Lord!"



INTERESTING FACTS ABOUT PALM TREES & PALM SUNDAY



- 1. The Palm Tree and its branches symbolize Life Everlasting as palm trees are evergreens which do not shed their leaves and they grow ever upwards towards heaven right across the world!
- 2. The waving of palm or olive branches (as olive branches are used in some cultures on Palm Sunday) symbolize peace and victory. Still today to give or receive an 'olive branch' is a sign of peace and reconciliation-restoring goodwill and harmony.
- 3. Historically, it was customary during Jesus' time for people to pay homage and honour by laying palm branches or their cloaks or clothing in front of special people to show respect. Doing so for Jesus was acknowledging that He was truly special-of high order.

The Gospel of John tells of how Jesus was welcomed into Jerusalem just days before he was put to death on the Cross of Calvary: "When the great crowd that had come to the feast (of the Passover) heard that Jesus was coming to Jerusalem, they took palm branches and went out to meet him, and cried out: 'Hosanna! Hosanna to the Son of David! Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord" John 12:12-13

4. Blessed Palms received at Mass on Palm Sunday, should NOT be thrown away or discarded. Instead, they should be returned to the parish Priest to be used in making the ashes for Ash Wednesday the following year.

- 5. *According to Canon Law (1171), all blessed items are to be treated with reverence. If there is a need to dispose of such items, they should be buried or burned.
- 6. "Blessed Palm or Olive branches should not be kept as amulets, or for to dispelling evil spirits. Instead blessed Palms and Olive branches should be kept in the home as a witness to faith in Jesus Christ and in his Paschal Victory over death." Many people across the globe hang their Palm branches and Crosses on their doors, just as we would hang a Christmas wreath or garland.
- 7. Christ's Triumphant Entry into Jerusalem was foretold in the Old Testament in Zachariah 9:9 which states: "Exult greatly, O daughter of Zion! Shout for joy, O daughter of Jerusalem! Behold: your king is coming to you, a just savior, humble and riding on a donkey"
- 8. The Palm Sunday Gospel is usually taken from the synoptic Gospels of Matthew, Mark and Luke (eg. Luke 22: 14-56) and recounts: The Last Supper, Jesus' agony in the garden, Judas' betrayal, Jesus' arrest and persecution Jesus' Passion.


Jesus is challenged by religious leaders on His authority and confounds them with His answers

Day 6: Good Friday




Jesus is crucified and dies

Day 7: Black Saturday




Jesus is buried in the tomb
