Our Virtue Focus This Week Is: DETERMINATION

"The heights by great minds reached and kept, were not attained by sudden flight, but they while their companions slept; were toiling upwards through the night"



Determination requires a mind-set that is goal centred and results focused. If we are determined we will always have a clear vision of what we want to achieve and a strategic plan on how to attain this.

In a recent interview with **Usain Bolt** (now retired as a professional athlete)- still deemed the 'Fastest Man Alive' (as no one across the globe has managed to break his records set for the 100 and 200 meters to date); he stated that: 'dogged determination and strong self- belief' were the hall mark of his success.

When asked how he was able to achieve Gold Medals in sprinting in three successive Olympic Games (2008, 2012 and 2016)-a feat which had never been achieved before and to date has not been equalled or surpassed in his area of athletics; he responded by emphatically stating that:

"Everyone who competes professionally has certain qualities, namely: natural talent or a gift, a good team of expert coaches to guide and direct them and a high level of dedication and discipline to withstand the rigorous and consistent training and sacrifice that is required to succeed at the elite level of any sport. However, the key factor that I find is the game changer, is the level of sheer determination and self-belief which one holds to keep driving onwards and upwards, when others around you are losing faith."

Determination allows us to achieve at the highest levels in any field, no matter how long it takes or how challenging the journey to the outcome gets.

Let us all strive to be more determined in all that we do because ... "with Christ all things are possible!"
