- **The New RE Curriculum** has started to be embedded across **EYFS and KS1**-we are starting in the lower school and moving gradually upwards
- The Curriculum is the Religious Education Directory or RED. It is a directory because it is guiding our children and us to get to KNOW GOD MORE CLEARLY. The picture to the left is how the actual book looks
- RE puts our children's faith central to their lives and brings them to deeper understanding of GOD, our Virtues, Values, Catholic Life and Mission
- Our children will be discussing what we believe as Catholics and how we should live our Faith In Action daily linked to our real life.
- Our children will learn to love themselves and know they are all Wonderfully Made by God
- The learning includes Prayer and Liturgy so all our children from EYFS to Year 6 need to learn their prayers: Our Father, Glory Be, Hail Mary, The Angelus, The Nicene Creed, The Confiteor

- Black sensible girls and boys school shoes-no boots above the ankle.
- Sober and simple haircuts for boys (no Mohawks or designs)
- Simple age appropriate girls' hair styles natural or braided (no coloured braids)



- Ribbons/hair clips must be bottle green, yellow, black or white
- No jewellery is allowed excepting small stud earrings in gold or silver for girls only- as these are safe for health & safety purposes
- Boys are not allowed earrings in school

- Ensure that your child gets enough sleep each night-at least 8 hours*
- Ensure he/she is eating a healthy, balanced diet and drinking lots of water
- Ensure that he /she is doing good practise and revision for at least 20-30 minutes each evening
- Motivate and encourage your child to do his/her very best-the future depends on it

Class Trips-right across the year which may have a charge sometimes if a coach is involved




