#### THE YEAR 6 WORK ETHICS



- Be Present at school each day in full and correct school uniform
- Be Enthusiastic and ready to work hard and support your peers who may need your help
- Be Prepared by completing your home work fully and to the highest standard and quality. Read & do your own research independently
- Be Confident and approach every task with an I CAN DO IT attitude
- Be Diligent and Stay On Task -put in the extra effort-study your times tables and spelling words daily
- Be A Role Model -become the example that the younger children should emulate- you are the school's Leaders-Emulate Christ in Servant Leadership
- Be An Ambassador of St Antony's prepared to lead, represent and serve with humility and kindness.

#### CRUCIAL YR. 6 INFORMATION

- School starts at 8.00 am promptly for Yr. 6 each morning!
   85% (51) of our 60 pupils get in at 8am daily to get ahead now!
- Absences & Lateness are strictly monitored as these are indicators of a range of issues. 90% (55) get in early daily. 100% need
- Year 6 Attendance so far is on average 95% (55) ... so on average 5% of pupils have been absent and this is week 2.
- Home Work is marked first thing each day- we have a few children routinely NOT completing Home Work. Check!
- Knowledge of Times Tables is still not as it should be as only 80% (48 pupils) know their times tables by heart now.
- Spelling is still weak for many children- please practise!
- Handwriting and presentation for many still needs great improvement-practise, practise, practise!
- Some children still need to develop the drive, focus and diligence to begin achieving at their personal best. Help!

#### OUR BEHAVIOUR MANAGEMENT



## Positive behaviour management is used right across the school at St Antony's.

All pupils begin each day 'ON TRACK'

- Praise, points, rewards, certificates are given for staying on track through the days/Termly
  - If a pupil does not behave or follow instructions
- lst they are given a verbal caution
  - <sup>2nd</sup> If the inappropriate behaviour continues their name is moved to **CAUTION**
- -3<sup>rd</sup> If the wrong behaviour persists the pupil is put on **RED ALERT!** Resulting in **time out** or the pupil sent to an **SLT** member (Head Teacher)
- For serious infringements or for habitual repeated rule breaking parents are called in & a programme to remediate the behaviour pattern is agreed/put in place.

#### **HOMEWORK POLICY**

Why do we need homework?

Homework is recognized as being important for a number of reasons.

- It reinforces learning that has taken place during the lesson.
- It can stimulate interest outside of school.
- It can improve academic performance.
- It is seen by most parents as *extremely important* and can strengthen the relationship between School, Pupil and Home.
- It a key issue in raising attainment.

#### STANDARD SCHOOL PROCEDURES

- Holidays in term time are not allowed as the Government and Newham Borough have clearly stipulated ~ Families are expected to take breaks during the normal school holidays.
- Correct School Uniform: clothes, shoes, ties, tights, haircuts (see policy), PE kit/swimming kit must be worn to school on the days needed. A letter went home clearly showing and stating what is allowed-copies available today.
- All uniforms should be labelled. Lost uniforms are returned if labelled. Mrs Samuels and staff can be contacted regarding lost property. Lost Water Bottles are numerous in school. Lost one?
- Any Concerns? ~ Discuss issues relating to your child firstly with the class teacher. If you are still unsure then speak with a member of SLT( your child's Phase Lead)-The Head is the last port of call.

#### **HOLIDAY BOOSTER SESSIONS**

- During The February Half Term-Monday 17th to Wednesday 19<sup>th</sup> 2025 there will be SATS Booster Classes for all year 6 pupils- tuition is done free of cost -a £5 charge for SATS workbooks!
- These BOOSTER TUITION CLASSES are for all the year 6 pupils no matter what level they are
- Boosters Start at 9:00am and end at 1:30pm
- During the Easter Holiday Break -BOOSTER TUITION CLASSES are again held for all the year 6 pupils starting at 9am and ending at 1:30pm-these have proven to be very effective with final preparations for SATS. £5 for books
- Let's thank our generous year 6 lead and staff for giving their time so willingly &selflessly.


